## ***The United States and the European Union: From 20th Century Partnership to 21st Century Rivalry with Claudia Dunlea***

**Course Description:** Forged in the aftermath of World War II, the transatlantic partnership between Europe and the US has proven successful and resilient over the second half of the 20th century. Europe developed from a continent in need of US aid and support after World War II, to a partner during the Cold War. However, the international environment changed radically with the fall of the Berlin Wall in 1989, and later, the shock of the terrorist attacks on September 11, 2001. The question for the 21st century is therefore: Will we remain partners or become rivals? The Europeans cannot match the raw military size of the US. However, the EU already is a new sort of superpower—and the US seems to be oblivious to this trend. To this extent, this course intends to give a thought-provoking assessment of the EU's international influence; it's economic, political, and cultural strengths; and European thinking as a competitive alternative to Americanism.

**Biographical Information:** Dr. Claudia Dunlea is Visiting Instructor of History at Florida Atlantic University (FAU). She received her doctorate in European Integration History from the University of Hamburg, Ger-

many in 2003. Dr. Dunlea is the author of "Die Außenbeziehungen der europäischen Gemeinschaft für Kohle und Stahl von 1952-1960: Die Anfänge einer europäischen Außenpolitik?" a book which investigates the origins of a supranational European foreign policy in the 1950's. Her recent research on the diplomatic relations of the European Union was published in two articles: "The Future Union Embassies — The Beginning of the End of National Diplomacy?" and "Charles de Gaulle und das Scheitern einer europäischen Diplomatie".

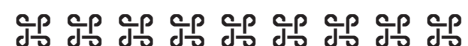

## **Why They Rebel: Challenges and Opportunities in the Middle East with Mehmet Gurses**

Winter Lecture Series (Thursdays) January 5, 12, 19, 26, 2012

Course Description: The popular uprisings that started in Tunisia in January 2011 and later spread to other countries in the region have turned the world's attention to the unsustainable state-society relations. This lecture series will address the social, economic, and political foundations of state-society relations in the region. What are the dynamics behind the demands for regime change in North Africa and Middle East? Can they become democrats? What lies ahead?

### **Biographical Information:**

Mehmet Gurses is an Assistant Professor of Political Science at Florida Atlantic University. He received his B.A. degree in political science and international relations from Marmara University in Istanbul, Turkey, and his doctorate from University of North Texas. His research interests include democracy and democratization, ethnic and religious conflict, post-civil war peace building, post-civil war democratization and the emergence and evolution of the Islamist parties in the Middle East. His publications have appeared in *International Interactions*, *Social Science Quarterly*, *Civil Wars*, *Defense and Peace Economics*, *Democratization* and *Nationalism and Ethnic Politics*.

## ***The Most-Hated Queen of France: The Life and Death of Marie Antoinette with Claudia Dunlea***

**Course Description:** In 1770, the 14-year-old Austrian Archduchess Maria Antonia, youngest daughter of Empress Maria Theresa, left Vienna for Versailles to marry the future King Louis XVI of France. As Marie Antoinette, she spent the next two decades at the most splendid court of Europe, initially admired as the personification of 18th-century French royal style. However, by the time she died under the blade of the guillotine at the age of 38 during the French Revolution, she was loathed as no queen of France ever had been. 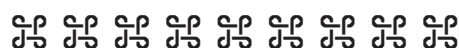
