Tennis Rules and Regulations For Club Members Without Tennis Privileges

- May play after 12:30 p.m. (open play only).
- May have guests... guest fees apply.
- May reserve a court by calling CC or AC two days in advance.
- May take lessons and clinics.
- May play after the Pro Shop closes. Sign in sheets will be posted at Center Court for members to register themselves/guests.
- May not play on teams, play in tournaments, leagues or social events.

TENNIS RULES

WHAT YOU CAN EXPECT

1. Tennis courts and facilities will be maintained in optimum condition.
2. The staff will remain current in their knowledge of tennis techniques, equipment, court maintenance and all related tennis activities.
3. Members will be made welcome and invited to be introduced to the staff, our facilities and programs.
4. Members may expect courteous, friendly, and helpful service, so that they may enjoy the benefits of Tennis Membership at Boca Pointe.

GENERAL POLICY

1. In Season: the period beginning November 1 and ending April 30 of each year.
2. Director of Tennis: The Director of Tennis and any member of the tennis staff designated by the Director of Tennis to handle specific assignments and duties.
3. The Tennis Committee may establish and modify rules subject to approval of the Board. At all other times, the rules of the USTA shall apply.
4. The Director of Tennis is responsible for the uniform application of the policies, rules and regulations. The Tennis Committee shall develop and interpret all policies, rules and regulations applicable to the tennis program at Boca Pointe, in accordance with established rules.

5. The Director of Tennis is authorized to implement temporary rules as may be necessary during peak periods of play, tournaments and special events, consistent with overall Club policies.
6. The use of the tennis courts and related facilities shall at all times be subject to the control of the Director of Tennis who will determine the suitability of the courts for play. When necessary, courts will be closed for maintenance, safety considerations or adverse weather conditions.
7. Courts are to be closed when the Club's lightning detection equipment sounds the alarm for dangerous lightning conditions (single blast of siren). Play may be resumed upon the sounding of the "all clear" signal (triple blast).
8. All special tennis activities, other than open play, must be approved by the Director of Tennis.
9. Members and their guests may only use the tennis courts during the approved hours of operation.
10. In p.m. time period, play is limited to one hour and thirty minutes.
11. Members wishing to play during the evening hours at Center Court shall call and make a reservation. To conserve energy, lights will be on only for the number of courts and times reserved during the evening hours.
13. Children under the age of sixteen are not allowed on the courts at any time without adult supervision.
14. Members who fail to comply with tennis rules, policies and procedures may be subject to action by the Club's Grievance Committee.

COURT RESERVATIONS

1. Reservations may be made in accordance with the rules of the reservation system, which shall be posted each season.
2. Members without computerized court reservations may use the courts on an "as available, first come, first serve" basis. Members may reserve an available court either in person or by telephone.
3. All players and their guests should check in at least ten minutes prior to scheduled time of play.
4. At the end of the reserved playing period, players must promptly relinquish their court to the next reserving group of players. Players are not to walk on the court while others are still playing. Please use the entrance at the end of each court to enter and leave.
5. Members and houseguests must be prepared to present their membership cards and guest cards to the tennis staff at the time of check-in.

DRESS CODE

1. Collared shirts and tennis shorts are recommended for all men players. Women 's tennis wear includes tennis blouses, tank tops, skirts and shorts. Women may not play in midriff tops or sports bras. Men may not play shirtless or in sleeveless tee shirts or tank tops.
2. Tee shirts with BPCC and tennis related logos are permitted. Shirts containing advertising messages or graphics, except for USTA or tennis apparel manufacturers logo, are strictly prohibited.
3. Cut-off blue jeans, jams, Bermuda walking shorts, bathing suits, gym shorts, slacks and running shorts are not permitted. Warm up or sweat suits, or either the jacket or slacks of a warm up or sweat suit may be worn.
4. Only regulation tennis shoes are permitted.
5. Proper tennis attire is required at all times. Members and guests not properly attired will not be allowed to play. Children are required to conform to adult dress codes.

TENNIS ETIQUETTE

1. Players are expected to use proper tennis etiquette at all times.
2. Players should not arrive at their designated court more than two to three minutes before the scheduled time of play and must wait outside the fence. If other members are still playing when you arrive at the court, please keep noise and movement to a minimum. When time expires players should be allowed to finish the point, not the game or set in progress.
3. Members should enter their designated court at the appropriate court entrance and should not cross over an adjacent court.
4. The Director of Tennis and staff has the authority to remove any player(s) from the courts whose conduct is deemed either unacceptable or inappropriate.
5. Members are requested to change their shirts in the locker rooms and not at the courts.
6. Coffee cups and drinks should be placed in the cup holders on the net posts, and not on the tables under the canopies.
7. Members should dispose of all garbage in appropriate containers located at courtside prior to leaving the court.
8. Tennis bags should be stored on the racks provided under each canopy and not on the tables under the canopies.

9. Smoking is not permitted at the Center Court or Athletics Center tennis facilities.
10. Members are required to return BPCC towels to the appropriate receptacles.
11. Pets are not permitted at the Center Court or Athletics Center facilities, including courts, pools and cafés.
12. Bicycles may only be parked in the designated areas in the parking field at Center Court and the Athletics Center.

GUESTS

1. Resident non-members of Boca Pointe Country Club may not be guests on the tennis court at any time.
2. Every guest must be registered at all times when playing at BPCC. Guest registration and reservations should be made at Pro Shops during normal business hours. The Director of Tennis shall provide a procedure for after-hours registration. These procedures will be posted outside the Pro Shop on "sign-in" sheets.
3. There will be a maximum of three (3) guests per member, at any given time.
4. Guests are subject to fees as prescribed by the Board of Governors.
5. Members must be on the court or in the court area with their guest(s). Members will be charged the posted fee for their unregistered guest.
6. Guests may not have guests.
7. Members with a valid companion card are not subject to limitations regarding the number of times a companion may accompany them or the time of play.
8. Members with a valid companion card must register their companion prior to play.
9. No guest will be allowed to play at either facility prior to 11:15 a.m. from November 1 to April 30 ("in-season"). At all other times (off-season) they may play at any time based upon court availability.
10. The Director of Tennis shall have the authority to exclude guests from specific time periods to eliminate potential court compaction.
11. Member's children between the ages of sixteen and twenty-two (except those with membership cards) must register and may play an unlimited number of times, in accordance with Club rules and policies.
12. Athletics (non-tennis) and social members may be guests subject to the limitations on guest privileges and the payment of the appropriate guest fee.

LESSONS

1. All lessons must be scheduled through the Pro Shop. Lesson fees will be posted in the Tennis Pro Shops at both Center Court and the Athletics Center. Payments for lessons are to be made at the Pro Shop prior to going on the lesson court.
2. The Director of Tennis has the authority to set aside two (2) courts at each facility in the morning time period for lessons, clinics and any other member educational or training program.
3. A member is not permitted to use the Club's facilities for tennis lessons from tennis professionals not affiliated with the Club without the prior written approval of the Director of Tennis.
4. All member cancellations of a tennis lesson within 24 hours of the scheduled lesson will result in a charge equivalent to the cost of the lesson missed.
5. Tennis professionals may give lessons to non-members provided that tennis equity members and Athletics tennis members are given first priority for lessons.

TENNIS DEMO RACQUETS

1. Demo racquets are available on a first come, first serve basis and may not be reserved and must be returned each day after use. A club membership card or other acceptable identification card must be left as security.
2. A member's account will be charged the member price for any demo racquet that is lost or damaged.
