October 7 - O.J. Simpson 1984 murder trial with emphasis on controversial procedural and ethical dilemmas.

October 14 - Is the death penalty ever appropriate for offenders who do not kill their victims? Can a child molester be executed for brutally raping a child even though she was not murdered?

October 21 - Is it appropriate to strip search a 13-year old if school officials reasonably suspect she is concealing drugs? What if the drugs are prescription drugs (Ibuprofen) or over-the-counter drugs (Aleve)?

October 28 - The final session will be a special treat for the members. Last January, Professor Kerker took 23 students on a 12-day academic study tour to Washington D.C. to the Presidential Inauguration of Barack Obama. The program format included presentations by influential political and media speakers in the morning and site visits to organizations and embassies in the afternoon. Students had the unique opportunity to not only witness history, but also be part of history, as they celebrated the swearing in of the first African-American President. Tip of the Week

Hybrid From The Rough

When To Use It

Unless the ball is sitting down deep, or if the grass is wet, give your hybrid the green light from the rough. Otherwise, swallow your pride, grab a short iron and hack the ball back out to the fairway.

Which One?

To make sure you advance the ball safely, opt for your highest lofted hybrid. More loft will help you pop your ball out of the deep grass.

Why It Works

A hybrid mimics many of the design elements common to the modern fairway woods, including a short hosel. This feature alone makes a hybrid a better choice than an iron from the rough. The typical long hosel of an iron is prone to getting tangled up by long grass, which forces the face open or shuts it down through impact.
