## Tip of the Week - How to make a Solid Putting Stroke

**Your Goal** - A putting stroke that contacts the ball in the center of the face and starts the ball on the line you've chosen.

**The Key** - There are many ways to make a solid stroke, but one trait all good putters share is keeping their head still throughout the stroke. You can't keep your putter on line if you move your head, nor can you keep your head still if you move the putter on the wrong path. A steady head allows your hands, arms and shoul-

ders to move the putter correctly.

**How To Get It** - On a sunny day, set up to the ball with your shadow directly in front of you. Have some one place two balls on both sides of your head's shadow. Now, make your putting stroke. Hold your finish and check your shadow. If your head's shadow is still between the two balls, you're perfect. If not, repeat your stroke with a focus on keeping your head between the two balls.

## Lynn University Criminal Justice Series

with Sindee Kerker, J.D.

Wednesdays, 7:00 p.m. to 8:30 p.m. in the Multipurpose Room. Cost \$20 for the series. This course will explore legal and ethical issues resulting from trials and United States Supreme Court decisions.

**October 7 - O.J. Simpson 1994 murder trial** with emphasis on controversial procedural and ethical dilemmas.

**October 14 - Is the death penalty ever appropriate for offenders who do not kill their victims?** Can a child molester be executed for brutally raping a child even though she was not murdered?

**October 21 - Is it appropriate to strip search a 13-year old** if school officials reasonably suspect she is concealing drugs? What if the drugs are prescription drugs (Ibuprofen) or over-the-counter drugs (Aleve)?

**October 28 - The final session will be a special treat for the members. Last January, Professor Kerker took 23 students on a 12-day academic study tour to Washington D.C. to the Presidential Inauguration of Barack Obama.** The program format included presentations by influential political and media speakers in the morning and site visits to organizations and embassies in the afternoon. Students had the unique opportunity to not only witness history, but also be part of history, as they celebrated the swearing in of the first African-American President. Steve Engle, Professor of History, has been at FAU since 1990, has served as graduate director and chair of the department. He received numerous research and teaching fellowships including a Fulbright to Germany where he spent the year teaching and conducting research for his work on German-Americans in the Civil War. He has held several fellowships including a Gilder Lehrman Fellow, a Huntington Library Fellow, Marquette University, has lectured widely in Germany and the United States, including most recently the Smithsonian Institution. His recent work is entitled "All the President's Statesmen: Abraham Lincoln and the Negotiation of Power in the Civil War," which will appear in the future with the Johns Hopkins University Press.
